Trusting Christ during COVID-19

The impact of COVID-19 is felt all over the world. At the time of writing this, almost one million cases have been confirmed worldwide with more than 200,000 of those in the United States. The numbers are rising quickly, and the temptation to live in fear is high.

When we find ourselves missing the luxuries we had only weeks ago, we give thanks for what we do have and praise God for his provision (1 Thess 5:18).

We were created to be connected (Gen 2:18). We were created to be in intimate relationship with other human beings. Not through the lens of a camera and on the other side of a screen, but flesh to flesh, eye to eye.

While this season of stillness and separation from people we care about is difficult, we choose to still believe that the work God is doing in this time is going to be worth it. We choose to engage with Holy Spirit in a more intimate way than we ever have before. We can partner with him in our individual families, our marriages, our relationships with our children and roommates and set the example of how to love and be loved the way Jesus demonstrated in his life and ministry.

We trust Jesus. Our horse sessions may be temporarily suspended, but our ministry is not. Join us in this season and press into the Lord. Trust Him with us.

Led vs. Driven | By Amy Mort

Bubbles is a pony we have owned for several years now. She runs, trots, and bucks just like any other horse. You can ride her, and groom her, and even drive her from behind. But she isn't like most horses. Bubbles is almost totally blind in both eyes. Unless you looked closely into her cloudy eyes you would not be able to tell that she cannot see. She does all of these things only within the safety of her small fenced pasture.

I noticed one day that she responded so differently to me leading her than she did to me driving her with long lines from behind. When I led her she seemed to trust me more. She followed me willingly, staying close to know which way I would turn, stopping when I stopped, looking to me for direction. However, when I would drive her she became fearful, tentative, and more unsure of herself. She didn't know which way I would direct her and couldn't tell what was in front of her.

This is quite like our relationship with Christ. Being led suggests a guiding force, sincerity of motive, and ultimately requires our submission. Being driven is more aggressive, or forceful. There is still a choice involved of how we follow. Do we follow willingly or do we plant our feet in stubbornness, not trusting our Father to guide us? Maybe we are fearful that he might lead us in the wrong direction or do we get so distracted by the things around us that are going on that we stop focusing on Him?

In Psalm 23:2-3 it says He leads us by still waters, not he drives us through the river. It says He leads us in paths of righteousness, not he drives us to do what is right and good. He also led his people out of slavery by a pillar of a cloud by day and then a pillar of fire by night. God wants to lead us, not force us to be with him and obey him. He wants us to choose to be in relationship with him, follow him closely, and seek him wholeheartedly.

Training Tip: As you lead your horse around this week, pay attention to how they position themselves. Do they willingly follow you, lag behind, or are they pulling you to get to where they want to go? Sometimes doing a change of direction switches things up enough to get them moving again. Pay attention to whether they stop and turn when you do, or whether they choose to do what they want to do despite the consequences? How is this like your relationship with Christ, are your choosing to seek after him or planting your feet in protest having to be drug along?
